


### **2023 YEAR IN REVIEW**

New philanthropic award! Thanks to a collaboration between FACES staff and the Rady Children's Hospital Foundation, the FACES program applied for and received a \$205,000 award from the Conrad Prebys Foundation. Funds will support FACES students' participation in Certified Nursing Assistant and Phlebotomy programs, Medical Academy access, CPR/ First Aid certification, and general staffing needs. We are so happy that the Conrad Prebys Foundation chose to support health career pathway programming and our future clinicians.











**Back at the hospital:** FACES held three of its signature events on the Rady Children's Hospital campus for the first time since COVID.

- Our Senior Showcase and Graduation ceremony featuring students from Crawford and Hoover High Schools was held in June. Parents, clinicians and a few partners were able to meander through a room full of posters detailing FACES students' experiences over the last three years and then stay for the official graduation.
- Lab Coat Ceremony hosted incoming seniors from Hoover, Crawford and Kearny High Schools in September. This marked the official start of FACES seniors' clinical rotations.
- Team FACES, kick off event for new sophomores, was also held on campus in October, as well.

### **Getting hired at RCHSD**

FACES for the Future has always strived to provide opportunities for our alumni to continue to grow through our programming and come back to work at Rady Children's Hospital. While we have had some alumni come back, we hope to increase that number significantly. Two alumni formerly worked at Rady's in the Center for Healthier Communities and Alexa's PLAYC. Currently, three FACES alumni are employed as a **Patient Access Representative** in Developmental Services, an **Administrative Associate** in Cardiology and a **Patient Care Assistant 2** in the Emergency Department.

Rady has many entry level positions that only require a high school education. One such opportunity is a Patient Access Representative. In this position you assist patients with check in, verify insurance, and communicate with clinicians, providing a great opportunity to get firsthand experience in a variety of clinical settings. Many health care careers require experience prior to applying for program admission. Why not obtain that experience and get a nice paycheck, as well! In addition, after the first year of employment we have a generous tuition reimbursement program and educational funds that could help pay for your college degree.

Another student stated, "I really enjoyed this opportunity to venture into the medical field through different departments as I got to see medical professionals at work firsthand."

In their research on healthy relationships, FACES juniors (Class of 2024) created a survey for their peers, family, and friends to learn about their communities' beliefs about relationships. They discussed their findings in the episode and also invited CCS' Staff Therapist, Karla Sanchez, to talk about careers in mental health and her own personal take on relationships.
